

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a person who had a large impact on the people of the United States. He was born in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1929. His father was a pastor, and Martin Luther King, Jr. became a pastor as well. He led a Baptist congregation in Montgomery, Alabama. As an African American man, Dr. King was treated differently than white people. After the Civil War (1861-1865) and into the 1960s, black people living in the South were discriminated against. They were not allowed to drink out of the same water fountains as white people. They could not sit in the best locations in a restaurant or on a bus. Some hotels and restaurants would not even allow black people to enter.

In the 1950s and 1960s, a large Civil Rights movement began to take place. African Americans wanted to be treated as equals. Dr. King and others encouraged people to demand equal rights. In fact, Billy Graham encouraged Dr. King and others in their fight for justice. Dr. King focused on nonviolent protests. He did not want people who supported equal rights to use weapons or violence to get what they wanted. Instead, he wanted peaceful demonstrations where people would march together to create change. In 1963, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. led a march in Washington D.C. Between 200,000 and 300,000 people from around the nation gathered at the foot of the Lincoln Memorial in the nation's capital. They demanded

that African Americans be treated as equal citizens. Dr. King gave a famous speech that day entitled "I Have a Dream." In this speech, he said, "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character." Unfortunately in 1968, he was killed by a person who did not believe that black people should be treated as equals. Today, the city of Atlanta has a memorial and center dedicated to the work of Dr. King.
