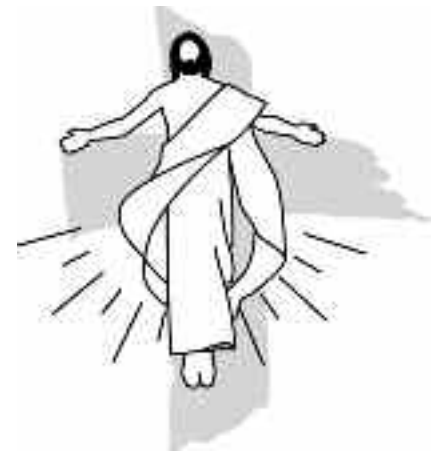

Additional Learning Activities

Section I – The First Advent of the Messiah

1. Discuss with the students the nature of Biblical prophecy. Emphasis should be placed on the fulfillment of prophecy as a vindication of the Word of God. Stress that since most prophecy has already been fulfilled, Christians can be assured that remaining Biblical prophecy will also come to pass.
2. Have the students memorize the prophecies given in this LIFEPAAC and their fulfillments. Divide the class into two teams and have a Scripture memorization bee.
3. Using two groups of students, have one group make a poster that relates the purpose of Christ and His coming at the First Advent and the second group do the same for the Second Coming of the Lord. These posters can be displayed in the classroom when completed.
4. Using two groups of students, form teams to discuss whether or not Christ was the fulfillment of the prophecies of the Messiah in the Old Testament. One team can take the affirmative and the other the negative, and then they should switch positions.
5. Make a list of the twelve minor prophets of the Old Testament. Using a Bible handbook or dictionary, write a one or two line biographical entry for each man of God.
6. Using a thesaurus, list as many synonyms and antonyms for the word advent as you can find. Make a second list of those words that can relate to Christ's First Advent.

Section II – The Messianic Offices

1. Divide the class into three groups and have each group search the Scriptures for as many passages as they can find on Christ as Prophet, Priest, or King. Bring the class back together to share their findings.
2. Discuss with the students the contrast between the accuracy of Biblical prophecies and the errors of the so-called modern-day prophets. Indicate that a prophet was and is known by the accuracy of his message.
3. Have a group of students research the difference between Christ's priesthood and the priest of the Old Testament. Similarities should also be noted. The group's findings can either be presented to the whole class or made into a poster for display in the classroom.

4. Have a group of students produce a skit depicting the events in either Genesis 14:13–20 or Numbers 21:6–9. Have the students write a script, select characters, and produce the skit.
5. Using a thesaurus, find as many synonyms and antonyms as possible for the words redeem and servant. Make a second list of the words you find that would relate to Christ's offices.
6. Read the prophecy of Jonah. Make a list of as many parallels to Christ as you can observe. You may wish to make a chart of these similarities for display in the classroom.
7. The following additional activity may be reproduced.
